## **Praise in Prison**

## Acts 16:19-40

## The Church at Philippi

- ◆ Paul and his missionary team were supernaturally led to <u>Philippi</u>.
- God supernaturally opened Lydia's <u>heart</u> to receive the gospel.
- God powerfully displayed His <u>power</u> and authority in the deliverance of the slave girl.
- Paul's obedience to the call of God resulted in <u>persecution</u>!
  - Matthew 10:16-20
    - Jesus told His followers what would happen as they follow His direction and proclaim the Kingdom of God.
  - 2 Corinthians 2:14-17
    - God will spread the fragrance of the knowledge of Christ through His disciples!
  - 1 Peter 4:12-16
    - Christians are encouraged to rejoice in persecution!

## **Praise in Prison!**

How do you respond to God when unexpected trouble and suffering come with no relief in sight?

- The Children of Israel responded by grumbling and complaining. Exodus 15:24 "And the people grumbled against Moses, saying, 'What shall we drink? "
- Paul and Silas responded to unexpected trouble and suffering by "praying and singing hymns to God"! Acts 16:25 "About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them,"
- ✤ Prior to Paul & Silas' imprisonment ...
  - ... They were suddenly seized and dragged into the market place. Acts 16:19
  - ··· They were falsely accused of anti-government activity. Acts 16:20-21
  - ··· They were beaten and thrown in prison. Acts 16:22-23
  - ··· They were put in the inner prison and shackled in stocks. Acts 16:24
- While Paul & Silas were imprisoned, the other prisoners were listening to them.
  - Christians have the opportunity to impact lives, especially in times of trouble!
  - Joseph is an example of someone who impacted lives while in prison. Genesis 37-45
- God's <u>purpose</u> was not hindered by the imprisonment of Paul and Silas! Acts 16:26
  - Suddenly there was a great earthquake!
  - The foundations of the prison were shaken!

- All the doors of the prison cells were open!
- All of the shackles on the prisoners were <u>unfastened</u>!
- The jailor was about to commit suicide because in Roman law, jailors were liable if prisoners escaped and the penalty was death.
  - But none of the other prisoners fled the jail!
- God continued to advance His plan to establish the church in Philippi by a supernatural moving of His power in the heart of the jailor!
  - The jailor, trembling in *fear*, fell before Paul and Silas.
  - The jailor wanted to be <u>saved</u>!
- God opened a door for the gospel as Paul and Silas shared the Word of God to the jailor and his household! Acts 16:30-34
  - The jailor and his family became the second additions to the <u>church</u> at Philippi!
- Psalm 71:17-23
