

To Judge or Not to Judge

April 27th & 28th, 2013

Matthew 7:1-5

“Judge not, that you be not judged.”

In this passage in Matthew 7, is Jesus saying that we are *never* to judge the actions of others? What about judging others when it's rape, murder, child abuse, dishonesty, cruelty or stealing?

Judge: “*Krino* ... primarily denotes ‘to separate, select, choose;’ hence, ‘to determine,’ and so ‘to judge, pronounce judgment.’”¹

Judge: “To Compare facts or ideas, and perceive their agreement or disagreement, and thus to distinguish truth from falsehood.”²

“If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother.” Matthew 18:15

Matthew 7:2 “...and with the measure you use it will be measured to you.”

Measure: “*metron* ... (b) of ‘a graduated rod or rule for measuring,’ figuratively Matt. 7:2”¹

❖ Jesus is addressing the standard and the attitude that individuals use in judging the actions of others.

↳ Is the measure the Word of God or our own opinion?

📖 John 12:44-50

❖ When someone is said to be “Judgmental” it means one who is “too willing to criticize other people’s actions and behavior and say that they are wrong.”³

❖ To be judgmental is to have a critical attitude that is unreasonable, ill-natured, and condemning.

Matthew 7:3-5 “Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?”

Speck (Mote): “*karphos* ... a small, dry stalk, a twig, a bit of dried stick.”¹

Log (Beam): “*dokos* ... ‘beams’ being received at their ends into walls or pieces of timber. The Lord used it metaphorically, in contrast to a mote, ‘of a great fault, or vice,’”¹

❖ Jesus says, “...*first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother’s eye.*”

↳ Jesus is teaching His disciples to first be aware of their own sinful actions in order to approach their brother’s problem with a humble attitude!

↳ Jesus is not teaching His disciples to never judge the actions of others!

1 Corinthians 5:1-12 “Is it not those inside the church whom you are to judge?”

- ❖ The problem is incestuous, sexual immoral behavior and the church at Corinth was tolerant of the relationship! *1 Corinthians 5:1-2*
- ❖ Paul made it clear that Christians were to judge sinful behaviors! *1 Corinthians 5:12*
 - ↳ In the Church ⇒ Sinful behavior left uncorrected will permeate the church like leaven in a lump of bread!
 - ↳ In the World ⇒ God’s Word applies to everyone!
“For John had been saying to Herod, ‘It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.’” *Mark 6:18*
- ❖ Paul reemphasized specific sins that needed to be addressed. *1 Corinthians 6:9-20*

God’s warning to His leaders!

Ezekiel 22:23-26 “... They made no distinction between the holy and the common, neither have they taught the difference between the unclean and the clean, ...”

Jesus directed His disciples to avoid a harsh, unreasonable, overly critical attitude when attempting to address issues in the lives of others in a supportive and helpful manner.
